UTTAM SCHOOL

On 12th July 2025, ISRN, with the CSR support of IRCTC, inaugurated the Uttam School Project at Composite School, Dighar, Bairia Block, Ballia. The inauguration began with a traditional Bhoomi Pujan ceremony, invoking blessings for the transformation of the school into a model of holistic education. The ceremony was attended by eminent dignitaries, including Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe, Vice President of Rambhau Mhalgi Prabodhini & Former MP (Rajya Sabha), along with senior state ministers, local leaders, and community members.

The event saw enthusiastic participation from students, teachers, parents, and villagers, who expressed joy and hope for the improvements to come. Cultural performances by schoolchildren added vibrancy, while dignitaries highlighted the importance of strengthening rural education infrastructure.

THE KEY DEVELOPMENTS ARE AS FOLLOWS

The month of July marked the commencement of construction and renovation activities under the Uttam School Project.

- **Boundary Wall Construction** – A 4,800 sq. ft. pre-cast boulder wall was constructed and installed around the school premises to enhance safety and security.
- **Gate Installation** – Work on two gates (main and back gate) was initiated to improve access and regulate entry into the premises.
- **Painting Work** – Painting of the entire school premises has commenced, with vendors engaged to ensure timely completion.
- **Classroom Renovation & Furniture Upgradation** – Renovation work in classrooms and upgradation of furniture is in progress. Vendors have been finalized, and measurements for windows and gates have been taken for installation.
- **Playground Development** – Development of the playground is underway, including facilities for volleyball and football.

- **Toilet Construction**—Construction of separate, hygienic toilets for boys and girls has been initiated to improve sanitation facilities. Vendors have been finalized, and drawings of the project (DOP) have been prepared by the civil engineer.
- **Flag Post & Seating Area** – Measurements have been taken for the installation of a flag post and a 13-meter chauwra along with a rounded seating space around the Peepal tree.
- **Computer Lab Setup** – Preparations for establishing a computer lab to introduce digital learning facilities have been made. Renovation work of the designated computer lab room has already started.



LOOKING AHEAD

The Uttam School Project is moving steadily towards transforming Composite School into a **model rural school**. In the coming months, ISRN will focus on:

- Completion of , **gates, and classroom renovations**
- Installation of **playground equipment and swings**
- Finalization of **toilets and sanitation facilities**
- Setting up of the **digital computer lab** for modern learning

With the combined support of **IRCTC**, ISRN, and active community participation, the Uttam School Project is paving the way for **inclusive, safe, and quality education** in Ballia.



Formation & Promotion of Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs)

NANO UREA AWARENESS PROGRAMME HELD IN BLOCK CHENANI, UDHAMPUR, JAMMU & KASHMIR

A Nano Urea Awareness Programme was recently organized for ISRN promoted Chennai Vegetables Producer Company Limited, Block Chenani, District Udhampur, Jammu & Kashmir, in collaboration with the Indian Farmers Fertiliser Cooperative Limited (IFFCO). The initiative aimed to sensitize farmers of SFAC supported Farmer Producer Organisation (FPO) promoted by ISRN about the benefits, usage, and application of IFFCO's Nano Urea—a pioneering product designed to boost crop productivity while ensuring environmental sustainability.

The programme witnessed enthusiastic participation from local farmers, Agriculture Department officials, Panchayati Raj representatives, and field functionaries. Subject experts from IFFCO and the Department of Agriculture shared insightful presentations on:

- The science and innovation behind Nano Urea
- Benefits over conventional urea
- Recommended dosage, foliar spray techniques, and timing
- Economic and environmental advantages for farming communities



Live demonstrations were conducted to familiarize participants with the correct method of mixing and spraying Nano Urea on crops. Farmers learned how this eco-friendly innovation enhances nitrogen-use efficiency, reduces soil pollution, and lowers input costs—making agriculture both profitable and sustainable.

The session concluded with an interactive Q&A, where farmers raised practical queries on storage, availability, and usage. IFFCO representatives assured continued guidance and reiterated their commitment to farmer welfare and green agriculture.

This awareness drive forms part of the broader government mission to promote sustainable agriculture and work towards the vision of doubling farmers' income in the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir.

SWASTH JEEVAN EXPRESS

The month of July was a landmark moment for ISRN with the launch of the **Swasth Jeevan Express**, a Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) supported by CONCOR, designed to bring quality healthcare to the doorsteps of rural communities in Ballia, Uttar Pradesh.

The Swasth Jeevan Express was formally inaugurated on **12th July 2025** at Composite School, Dighar, Bairia Block, Ballia. The event was attended by distinguished dignitaries including **Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe**, Vice President of Rambhau Mhalgi Prabodhini and Former MP (Rajya Sabha), who graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. Other eminent leaders present were **Shri Danish Azad Ansari**, Minister of State for Minority Welfare, Government of UP; **Shri Dayashankar Singh**, Minister of State for Transport, Government of UP; Smt. Meena Chaubey, State Minister, BJP UP; **Shri Shyam Narayan Singh**, MLC Mirzapur–Sonbhadra; **Shri Nirbhay Narayan Singh**, District President, BJP Ballia; and **Mr. Santosh Gupta, CEO of ISRN**.



INAUGURATION PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHTS

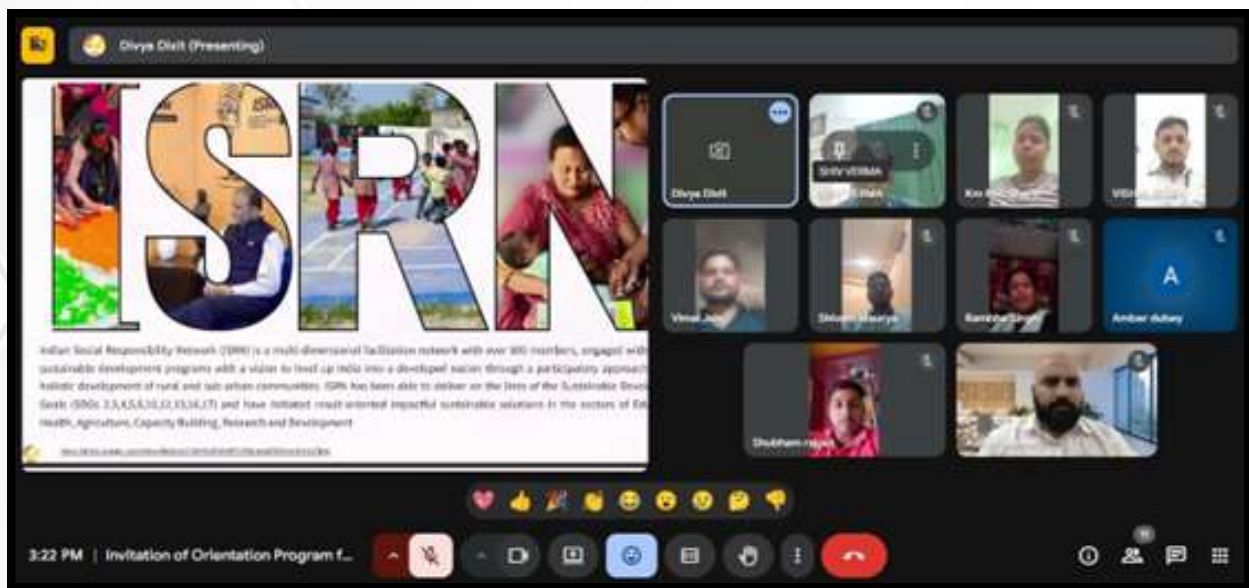
The ceremony began with the arrival and welcome of guests, followed by a cultural performance by schoolchildren. A traditional lamp-lighting and floral tribute ceremony was held, accompanied by a welcome song that set a vibrant atmosphere. Shri Nirbhay Narayan Singh welcomed the gathering, and Mr. Santosh Gupta, CEO ISRN, presented the background of the project. Special addresses were then delivered by Shri Sanjay Mishra, Shri Shyam Narayan Singh, and Smt. Meena Chaubey, followed by Shri Danish Azad Ansari. The Chief Guest, Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe, in his keynote address, emphasized the importance of equitable healthcare access for rural communities.

The event witnessed an overwhelming turnout of over 3,500 people, including residents, healthcare professionals, students, and social leaders. More than 50 patients received free on-the-spot consultations and medicines during the health camp organized alongside the ceremony. IEC materials were distributed widely, and the MMU's upcoming village schedule was announced. Among the voices of gratitude was Rajvati Devi (62, Pachrukhiya village), who emotionally shared how the MMU finally brought relief from her chronic ailments and gave her the feeling of being “truly heard” by doctors.



ORIENTATION OF THE PROJECT TEAM – 7TH JULY 2025

Ahead of the rollout, ISRN organized a full-day orientation programme for the MMU team on 7th July 2025. The sessions began with an introduction by Programme Officer **Mrs. Divya Dixit**, followed by an overview of ISRN delivered by **Associate Director Mr. Ashish Mansharamani**. The project briefing was conducted by **General Manager Mr. Samudra Naskar**, while IT Expert **Mr. Anuj** demonstrated the Mobile Medical Application. The orientation also covered roles and responsibilities, with **Mrs. Divya Dixit** leading the discussion on monitoring and evaluation, and **Mrs. Manisha Saxena** highlighting HLPPT's contribution to the initiative. The day concluded with special guidance from **Mr. Santosh Gupta, CEO of ISRN**. The programme not only provided the team with technical knowledge but also strengthened their community engagement skills, ensuring they were fully prepared for effective service delivery.



FIELD OPERATIONS & AWARENESS ACTIVITIES

From **12th to 31st July**, the Swasth Jeevan Express conducted **18 medical camps** across villages in Ballia. During this short period, the MMU:

- Conducted more than 50 awareness activities in villages
- Treated over 1,000 patients (54% male, 46% female)
- Performed 310 laboratory tests
- Traveled 605 kilometers to reach remote communities
- Distributed free medicines to all patients



The most common ailments treated included general weakness, hypertension, diabetes, gastric problems, seasonal infections, and skin diseases. These findings underscored the lack of accessible primary healthcare and showed how non-communicable lifestyle diseases are increasingly affecting rural populations.

Alongside clinical services, community mobilization played a central role. ISRN's two community mobilizers led door-to-door campaigns, organized village-level meetings, and engaged with ASHAs and ANMs to inform families about the MMU. Special efforts were made to encourage women's participation, particularly in areas where female turnout was initially low. IEC materials on maternal health, nutrition, and prevention of non-communicable diseases were distributed, ensuring sustained awareness. These grassroots-level efforts not only spread information but also built trust between the community and the healthcare team, leading to stronger participation in subsequent camps.



STORIES OF HOPE FROM THE FIELD

The first month of the MMU brought many moving stories of impact. **Mrs. Daulatiya Devi (81, Chandpur Diyar village)**, too weak to travel for treatment, received a full check-up and medicines at her doorstep. With tears of relief, she described the MMU as “a hospital coming to her home.”



Another inspiring story is of Guddu from Sonbani village, a disabled teacher who had silently battled uncontrolled diabetes and anemia. The MMU team provided treatment, diet counseling, and physiotherapy guidance, helping him regain strength. Today, Guddu proudly serves as a Health Ambassador, spreading health awareness in his community.

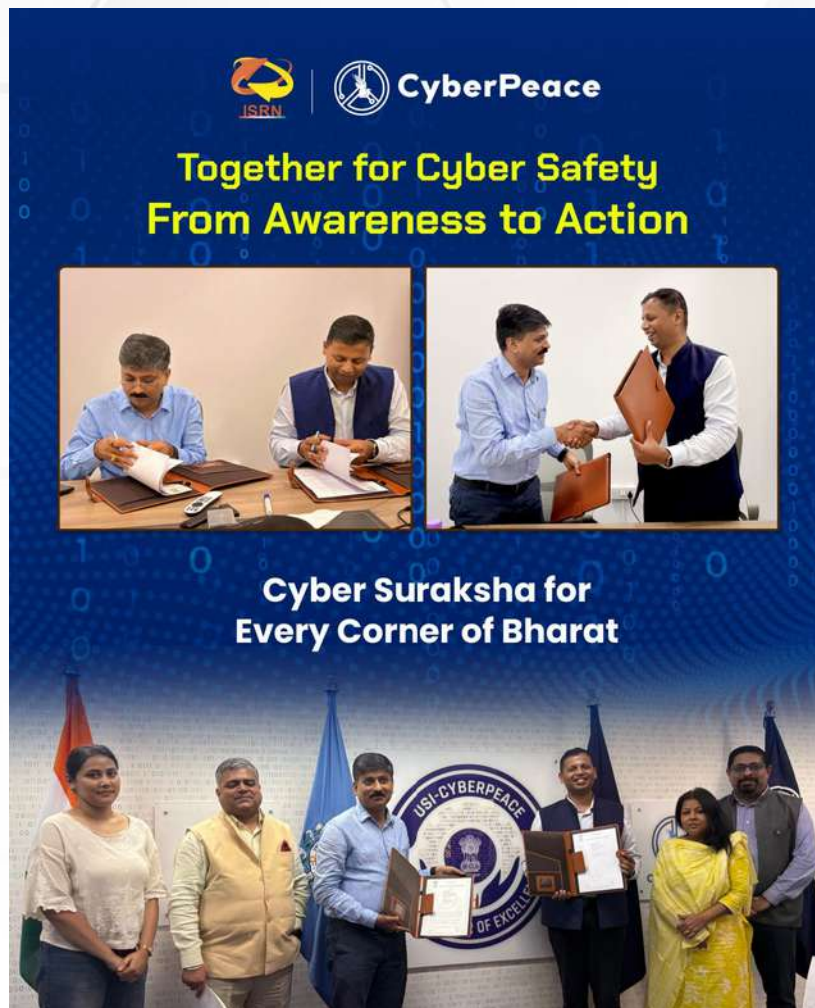

This partnership aims to equip individuals and institutions with the knowledge to navigate the fast-evolving landscape of AI, cybersecurity, and digital safety at mass scale.



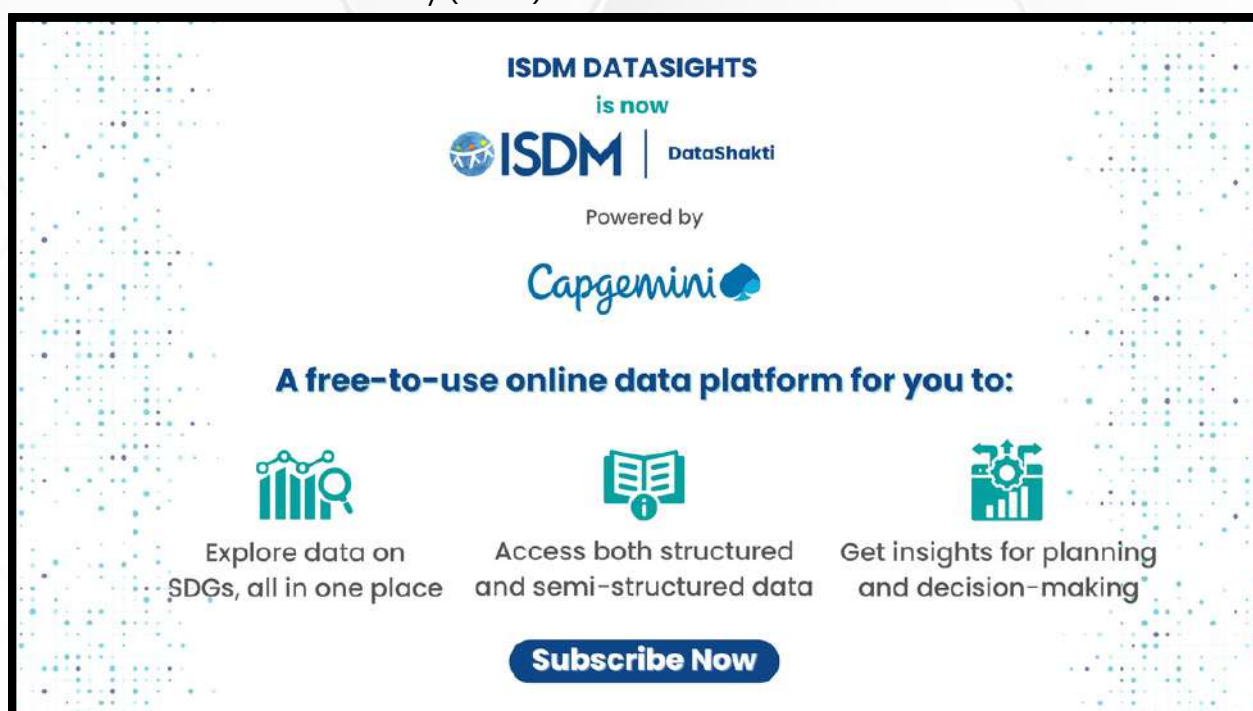

EURASIAN DOVE / COLUMBA DECAOCTO

It is so delicate and beautiful looking that people name their brands after it.

Known for its melodious and musical voice of 'ghoo-ghoo-ghoo', a beautifully coloured bird with a mix of pink and tinged gray, the Eurasian dove! It is called Eurasian Collared Dove due to its dark colour and light-black band on the upper part of the neck, which looks like a collar of a shirt/ blouse. Its back is light brown and fades to gray as it moves towards the wings and as it moves towards the feathers, the tail becomes dark brown. Its chest is light brown and the underside of the belly and tail are a beautiful pink. The black beak and reddish upper legs add to its already beautiful colour texture. The delicate neck is eye-catching in color. The beautiful eyes are dark red in color which looks black from a distance.

One of the 17 common birds of India, this bird belongs to the pigeon family, but it is a medium-sized bird than the pigeon. At a time when the number of pigeons is increasing very fast, the number of Eurasian dove is not increasing so fast in urban areas in India. Apart from Eurasian collared dove other species of Eurasian dove present in India are; Smart Dove, Little brown dove, and spotted dove. (Photos and videos taken by the author at his home) and at home Smart Dove also enjoys coexistence with other birds.

A slightly different 'hah...hah' sound can be heard for a couple of seconds when landing, and a flapping sound when perched, that immediately catches attention.

Eurasian collared dove is a non-migratory bird and is a colonial bird but due to cold weather, it migrates far away from its place to form a colony. It adapts to warm climates and is able to change its location as needed. In this way, they settle wherever they go and their zone increases. It is recorded in history that they were in Bulgaria until 1838 and



spread to Europe by about 1900-1920 when they settled in Germany from 1945 and reached Morocco and Egypt in the 20th century.

They tend to choose their partner for permanent residence, wherever there is plenty of food available. For courtship, they are seen kissing each other with their beaks. Generally they are monogamous. It builds a nest up to 1 kilometer away from its territory. Tree branches are excellent for them for nesting. A female Eurasian collared dove lays one or two white eggs at a time and can lay 3 to 4 eggs in a year.



There are also reports of laying 6 eggs in a year. After laying the eggs, the female Eurasian dove incubates the eggs at night and the male incubates them during the day. For 14 to 18 days they both incubate the eggs simultaneously and after that the chicks become fledged in another 15 to 19 days. During this time both take care of their young.



Male Eurasian doves display their intent for courtship by flying in different ways to attract their female counterpart for mating. It suddenly glides down from a height, in a circular motion, whereas to get from one place to another, it flies fast under normal circumstances.

Feeds mainly on grains and inhabits granaries, fields and areas where regular grains are available. Grains, plant shoots, and insects are its favourite foods. In urban areas, a large number is not seen at one place, but more than 10,000 have been observed at different places. Like pigeons, the droppings of the Eurasian dove is acidic, and the gas it ferments is harmful to everyone, causes serious lung damage when inhaled.
